OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By application filed October 30, 1980, John Walton Associates, Inc., Omaha, Nebraska seeks authority to connect an Automatic Dialing-Announcing Device.

Applicant is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of Nebraska with its principal place of business at Omaha, Nebraska. The name and mailing address of the principal officer of the corporation is John W. Walton, President, 1624 Douglas Street, Omaha, Nebraska 68102.

Applicant proposes to connect a Digital Products Corporation Model CGS 1000 automatic dialing-announcing device.

Applicant has agreed to include on all calls made on the automatic dialing-announcing device a statement of the nature of the call and the name, address and telephone number of the business or organization being represented.

Having reviewed the application, the Commission finds that the application does comply with the applicable statutes and Rules and Regulations of the Commission and a permit should be issued.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. AD-2 be and it is hereby granted and John Walton Associates, Inc., Omaha, Nebraska be and it is hereby authorized to connect an automatic dialing-announcing device in accordance with its application, the Nebraska Statutes and the Rules and Regulations of this Commission.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this order be and it is hereby made the Commission's Official Permit as hereinbefore set forth.
