BY THE COMMISSION:

By application filed October 17, 2001, QX Telecom, L.L.C. (QX) of New York, New York, seeks authority to operate as a facilities-based and resold interexchange carrier of telecommunications services within the state of Nebraska. Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on October 18, 2001. No protests were filed; therefore, this application was processed pursuant to the Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure.

O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

On January 29, 2002, the Commission approved an order in this docket authorizing OX Telecom, L.L.C. to provide facilities-based and resold interexchange telecommunications services in the state of Nebraska.

However, the name was incorrectly docketed and published. Therefore, the Commission incorrectly granted a certificate to OX instead of QX. As a result, the Commission staff notified the representatives of QX Telecom, L.L.C. informing them that the application would be republished and a corrected order would be entered after the protest period had lapsed.

The Commission is of the opinion that the order entered January 29, 2002, in Application No. C-2620 should be vacated.



O R D E R
