1. On October 14, 1999, the Public Service Commission (Commission) opened this docket to determine the authority the Commission has to facilitate the implementation of a "211" information and referral system by designating "211" as a reserved number for such a system.
2. The Commission participated in 211 Steering Committee meetings facilitated by Sen. Jim Jensen and his staff in 1999.
3. Subsequent to opening this docket, the Federal Communications Commission assigned "211" as a national abbreviated dialing code to be used for access to community information and referral service.¹
