BY THE COMMISSION:

On September 5, 2007, an Application was filed by AccessLine Communications Corporation (ACC), Washington, D.C., AccessLine Holdings, Inc., (AccessLine) Bellevue, Washington and Telanetix, (Telanetix) San Diego, California, seeking a transfer of control. Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on September 10, 2007. No protests were filed; therefore, this application is processed pursuant to the Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure.

O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

The Parties:

ACC is a wholly owned subsidiary of AccessLine Holdings, Inc., a Delaware Corporation. ACC holds authority to provide long-distance telephone service in Nebraska which was granted in Docket C-3320 on December 10, 2004.

Telanetix is a Delaware Corporation with offices at 6197 Cornerstone Court E. Ste. 108, San Diego, California. Telanetix is a leading developer of IP based video and conferencing solutions. The corporation is publicly traded on the OTC Bulletin Board (symbol: TNXI).

AccessLine is a Delaware Corporation. AccessLine does not hold a certificate of public convenience and necessity to offer telecommunications services in Nebraska.

The Transaction:

AccessLine has entered into an agreement with Telanetix whereby a newly created subsidiary of Telanetix will merge with AccessLine thereby having AccessLine surviving as a wholly-owned subsidiary of Telanetix. As a result Telanetix will gain direct control over AccessLine and indirect control over ACC.

The Applicants state the proposed transaction will improve business operations and will not affect the services provided to customers. According to the Application, ACC will benefit from the highly qualified and experienced management and financial resources of Telanetix.
