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Application Checklist Item #9:

“Retail rate(s) charged for basic voice service. If a subscriber line charge is assessed, the amount of the SLC. If no SLC is assessed then a statement that no SLC is assessed.”

Narrative:

Nebraska Central Telephone Company is committed to offering voice services at reasonably comparable rates for comparable services in urban areas. NCTC has included in this application a pricing document detailing the recurring and non-recurring pricing of the voice services offered through this project. The pricing for standalone basic voice service can be found in the pricing document provided for Application Checklist Item #8. NCTC does assess a Federal Access Charge (SLC) and the amount of that charge is detailed in the pricing document included with this application.

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Application Checklist Item #10:

“A description of the applicant’s commitment to offer broadband services to all households within the service area of the project for a minimum of five (5) years.”

Narrative:

NCTC has been committed to providing broadband service to its customers since 1999. NCTC has fulfilled all of its ETC responsibilities and has been committed to providing a usable level of broadband services to all of its customers. [REDACTED]

The funding requested in the application will provide NCTC [REDACTED]

Nebraska Central Telephone Company is committed to providing the supported broadband service upon completion of the deployment to each household within the proposed project service area for a period of no less than five years.

NCTC has been committed to providing voice telephone service since the 1920s. The proposed project area is within Nebraska Central Telephone Company’s incumbent local exchange service area, and as the Carrier of Last Resort, NCTC is committed to offering a voice grade service to all customers within the proposed project service area, including access to emergency services.

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Application Checklist Item #11:

“A description of the applicant’s commitment to provide broadband data to the Commission and its vendors for the duration of the State Broadband Data and Development (SBDD) program so that this broadband coverage area can be depicted on the Commission’s state broadband data inventory map and on the National Telecommunications and Information Administration’s (NTIA’s) national broadband map.”

Narrative:

NCTC has participated in the National Telecommunications and Information Administration’s National Broadband Mapping process and the Nebraska Public Service Commission’s State Broadband Data and Development program. NCTC has recently provided updated maps to these agencies so that NCTC’s current broadband coverage areas were depicted on the national and state broadband maps.

NCTC is committed to continuing to provide all required mapping data to the Commission and its vendors for its existing and new service areas so Nebraska Central Telephone Company’s broadband service coverage areas will be depicted on the Commission’s Nebraska Broadband Map and on the National Telecommunications and Information Administration’s National Broadband Map.

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Application Checklist Item #12:

“A description of the applicant’s financial qualifications, which may be filed on a confidential basis, to meet the commitments made in the application.”

Narrative:

The Commission has indicated that for companies filing Annual Report Form M, the information contained in Form M would be sufficient to meet the application requirement.

Nebraska Central Telephone Company’s Annual Report Form M illustrates the company’s financial position and is on file with the Nebraska Public Service Commission.

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Application Checklist Item #13:

Narrative:

Nebraska Central Telephone Company is an established rural, incumbent local exchange carrier operating in Nebraska and holds a certificate of public convenience and necessity to provide telecommunications services in the State of Nebraska.

NCTC commits to abide by all applicable Commission rules, regulations and orders.


